The H2HC 2025 Prizes for Innovation

Recognizing work driving systemic change in food and nutrition that advances health equity for youth in the U.S.



Criteria

Projects must:

- Operate within the U.S. and provide programs or services that advance health equity for youth (up to and including age 17)
- Align with one of the three prize categories
- Showcase work already in progress (not propose new or future work)

Criteria and Prize Categories

All work and projects must align with **one** of our three prize categories, be focused on youth (*up to and including age 17*), and be based in the U.S.

Prize Category 1:

Food and Nutrition Policy
Work Advancing Health
Equity for Youth

- Two prizes
- \$100,000 each

Prize Category 2:

Nutrition Education and
School Food

- Two prizes
- \$25,000 each

Prize Category 3:

Indigenous Food Justice
for Youth

- Two prizes
- \$25,000 each

Prize Category 1: Food and Nutrition Policy Work Advancing Health Equity for Youth



Projects might include:

- Innovative, collaborative, systemic policy work, at any level, that advances health equity for youth, with a preference for work that results in positive change for large populations of youth.
- Programs that showcase efforts that involve state and federal policies and practices.
- Researching, analyzing, and developing policies and programs, leading to meaningful change by influencing how governments and organizations make decisions.

Prize Category 2: Nutrition Education and School Food

Projects might include:

- Programs supporting children learning about, growing, gathering, or cooking healthy, nutritious, and culturally relevant foods.
- Shifting school policy, practices, and/or systems so that children have access to healthy school meals.
- Nutrition education and/or nutritious food in schools.

Prize Category 3:

Indigenous Food Justice for Youth

Projects might include:

- Access to, advancement of, and rematriation of traditional, nutritious, and affordable foods.
- Programs that shift control and stewardship of food resources to Indigenous communities to benefit children.
- Enhancements of the ability of Indigenous children to respond to their needs for healthy, culturally relevant Indigenous foods .
- Communities creating new pathways to support food justice for Indigenous children.

DC Central Kitchen

Nonprofit and social enterprise that combats hunger and poverty through job training and job creation.



Alameda County Recipe4Health

Model that integrates food-based interventions into healthcare settings to treat, prevent, and reverse chronic conditions; addresses food and nutrition insecurity and other social determinants of health; and improves health and racial equity.



StreetCred at Boston Medical Center

Helps families build nutrition security by offering financial counseling connected with pediatric visits.

Founding member of the Health by Wealth Collective, a coalition of health systems that is working to integrate economic mobility services into medical settings by sharing best practices and technical support.

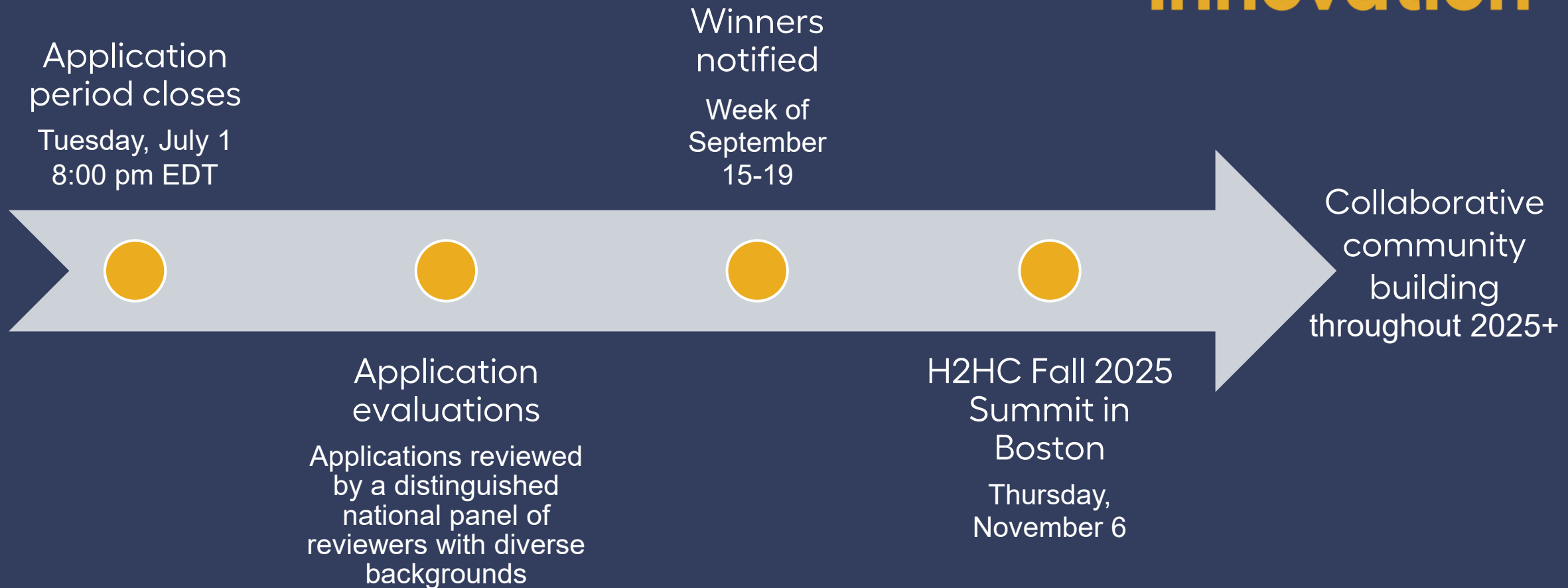


The Giving Grove
